#### **IV. RESEARCH SPECIALIZATION**

My pragmatic research investigates team-based, community-integrated approaches and interventions for tailoring outpatient pharmacist care throughout the life-course of individuals and populations. This work is particularly applicable in underserved, rural areas where pharmacists are often the most accessible, affordable, and frequently encountered healthcare professionals with the potential to integrate information and referrals with community-based organizations offering health-related social needs. The work is grounded in person-centered care principles; health behavior theories; implementation science; health-related social needs; and cognitive, social, and behavioral psychology. Areas of research specialization include: (1) evaluation of patient preferences and experiences of care encounters with pharmacists (2) patients' processing of medication information and resultant decision-making, (3) health services program evaluation, (4) health systems improvements, and (5) legislative, policy, and workforce effects on the delivery of pharmacist services in underserved rural communities. Findings from these areas of research contribute to: (1) the understanding of psychosocial factors mediating health behaviors throughout

the life-course of individuals and populations via community-integrated care approaches, (2) development and assessment of team-based approaches for tailoring care within and adjacent to patient encounters that create capacities for health goal achievement and need fulfillment, and (3) dissemination, implementation, and pragmatic evaluation of the resulting patient-reported and clinical outcomes of these interventions in practice.
